GENERAL MEMORANDUM FOR ACADEMIC COOPERATION AND EXCHANGE
BETWEEN NATIONAL INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY, KAGAWA COLLEGE
AND THE UNIVERSITY OF TOURS



The President of National Institute of Technology, Kagawa College and the President of the University of Tours, hereby accept to renew the agreement for academic exchange and cooperation, dated December 2015, and to develop mobility for students and academics for five years according to the following terms.

1. The two parties will promote in particular the following activities:
 - [1] Exchange of students
 - [2] Exchange of faculty members
 - [3] Exchange of scientific materials, publications, and information
 - [4] Joint research and meeting for research
2. These activities are to be carried out after mutual consultation between the two parties or the divisions concerned thereof. The themes of the joint projects and the terms for the exchanges will be negotiated case by case, and will be finalised by separate agreements.
3. All financial arrangements to pursue any of the above activities are to be negotiated for each specific case.
4. The two parties agree that, in the event of research collaboration leading to patent rights, copyrights and other intellectual property rights, a further agreement must be negotiated in each case in accordance with the policies of the two parties on intellectual property. The research agreement should be in place, signed by both parties, prior to engaging in the research collaboration.
5. All amendments to this memorandum should be in writing signed by both parties.
6. This general memorandum shall be effective upon signature by two parties and shall remain in force for a period of five years. The relevant authorities must approve renewal.
7. This general memorandum is only to express the intentions of the Parties. The expressed intentions are not binding and no legally binding obligations are intended to, or do, arise as a consequence of the signing of this MOU. Actions taken by either Party in reliance on this MOU will be at that Party's sole risk. Both parties acknowledge that this MOU and all subsequent agreements shall comply with all applicable laws, policies, and procedures.
8. Either institution could terminate this general memorandum at any time through written notice sent to the other institution expressing their desire to terminate the agreement with six (6) months prior notice without prejudice over activities previously agreed that in that time are being developed.
9. The general memorandum is written in English.
